Holland Township's municipal leaders say they will mark Earth Day, this year on Sunday, April 22, with some new efforts to protect the environment as well as continuing programs that are already in place.

"Holland residents have made it clear that they want us to protect our pure streams, wooded vistas and rural surroundings," said Mayor Daniel Bush. "For decades, prior township leaders have pioneered programs such as the recycling center and farmland preservation. Today, we're continuing those efforts and building on what was done before."

Recycling moves in new directions

On April 28, Holland's recycling team will hold Shredding Day from 8 a.m. to noon at the Holland Township Municipal Building, 61 Church Road. In an effort to help prevent identity theft, this event will be open to residents of any municipality. Items such as legal documents, bank statements, medical records, credit card and tax documents will be shredded for free as people watch. There is no need to remove paper clips, staples, file folders or even binders.

For the second year, Holland will hold an electronics recycling day later this spring. Also open to residents of any municipality, the motto for this event is "Anything with a cord, we'll take it." A date and time will be announced soon.

Holland's recycling center continues to operate, but residents also have the choice of recycling through the company that picks up their trash. The recycling center on Route 614 is open only to Holland residents and operates year-round on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday hours for the recycling center have just restarted on April 1 and will continue through October 31, operating from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The recycling center includes the ability to bring brush that is then chipped. Holland residents can pick up the resulting mulch at no charge. Large items can be brought to the dumpster at the rear of the recycling center that operates during the regular Saturday hours. Residents receive a card that allows two annual trips to the dumpster.

Green Team works

In 2012 Holland decided to join the Sustainable Jersey program that provides certification for municipalities that want to go green, save money, and sustain long-term quality of life. Under the program, a Green Team made up of residents was appointed and started meeting in September. They have identified actions the municipality can take to become more sustainable, and the program provides "how to" guidance and tools for making progress. The team is moving toward Bronze Level certification, which will give Holland priority access to many New Jersey grant programs.

Clean Water T-shirt contest

In a new program for this year, the Holland Township Parks and Recreation Committee is partnering with the Environmental Commission to sponsor a contest at the Holland School in which students design the art work for T-shirts. The theme is protecting Holland's streams that are classified as the purest in the state, especially from the dangers of storm water run-off that can contain fertilizer, pesticides, motor oil or animal waste. Entries are due April 25, and the three winning designs will be printed on T-shirts that will be sold to the public.
