Program Summary: The Upper Township School District is committed to energy cost savings while at the same time looking for ways to demonstrate strong sustainable initiatives. In April, 2017, the District Opted into the ACES Enhanced Renewable Product program, and renewed the program in November 2018 for the time period 2018-2020. Under the program, the District will receive 40% renewable electricity supply, thereby taking steps towards environmental sustainability efforts.

Onsite Renewable Generation System - Solar

Program Summary: Solar power derives clean, pure energy from the sun and helps combat greenhouse gas emissions and reduces our collective dependence on fossil fuel. As part of the District's energy audit, the District was advised to install photovoltaic solar panels for power generation. The District entered into a fifteen year Power Purchase Agreement for one solar field at the middle school and one at the elementary school. On February 16, 2017, the Upper Township Elementary School received final approval to operate its solar panels. The solar field, located behind the elementary school, is used to power the elementary and primary schools. The unit is 660 kW in size and its estimated annual energy generation is 760,065 kWh. According to the calculations, the elementary system offsets 33.04% of the electricity produced by the solar system.

Program Summary: In June, 2012 the Upper Township School District conducted an energy audit for all three schools in the District. Based upon the audit, the District had the potential of saving an overall 44.74% in energy usage. As a result of the audit, the District contracted with Honeywell Building Solutions to design and implement an Energy Savings Improvement Plan in 2015. Projects within the plan included lighting upgrades, domestic hot water heater replacement, building envelope modifications, solar installation, and installation of de-stratification fans. The work was completed in the 2017. Attached is the electric usage for the district from the 2016/17 school year, which was when the ESIP was completed, and the current school year. From the spreadsheet, you can see a 153.8% reduction in the overall electric consumption. The district went from using 1,826,733 KwH to utilizing less than 700,000 KwH per year.

School Gardens

Program Summary: The elementary school garden club meets periodically throughout the school year. Due to the large student interest, the club is split into two groups that meet once or twice a month. The focus of the garden club this fall was to save seeds from plants and vegetables, learn about and start a compost pile, and learn about what types of animals and insects are helpful and harmful to our gardens. When the Garden Club resumed in March, they focused their efforts on making worm farms and adding worms to the soil. They began propagating spinach, kale, lettuce, broccoli, brussel sprout, green beans and pea seeds that they will transplant into the garden beds. Additionally, the third-grade team has a plant unit including in their curriculum. The students are taught about the life cycle of the plant and then plant seeds that they later transplant to the raised beds in the garden. The UTES Garden club is also focusing on how to create gardens at home that will be successful. They have discussed and planted indigenous varieties of vegetables, herbs, and flowers to plant in the gardens.

Teachers are able to use the curriculum documents as a guide to know what to teach, how long to teach it, and best practices when teaching it. Program Summary: The elementary school initiative for the 2018/19 school year is an emphasis on creating and cultivating a strong mind, body, and soul which is achieved through respect for yourself and your community. This year, the school has designed several activities geared towards achieving the school's initiative. A healthy body is emphasized through the Jammin Minute each morning where the students perform a minute worth of exercises to keep their bodies active. A healthy mind is emphasized through the Amazing Race Challenge. All elementary

students and their parents were invited to an event where they would travel from room to room solving puzzles. Additionally, students who participated in the event were able to win games and take home books to read. The event was a huge success! On May 14, the staff worked hard on a health fair for the students and the community. Students, parents and community members were invited to participate in several activities (yoga, Zumba, nutrition seminars, etc.) to enhance their healthy mind, body, and soul. the students were each given a schedule and were able to visit classrooms, each with a different theme. Families learned about proper dental care, the effects of sugary drinks, making healthy food choices, and exercise (zumba, yoga, and obstacle courses).

Programs to Promote Physical Activity

Program Summary: Studies show that children spend hours every day in front of a screen (TVs, smartphones, tablets, and other devices) looking at a variety of media. Too much screen time and not enough physical activity adds to the problem of childhood obesity. For the 2018/19 school year, the staff and students of the elementary school are participating in a daily jammin minute. Parents watched a version of the 'morning announcements' at Back to School Night where they learned about the school-wide initiative to get moving each morning (a.k.a. Jammin Minute). During the morning announcements each day, one class in the building leads the school in a "Jammin Minute", where students spend one-minute modeling exercises for their classmates. The objective of the Jammin Minutes is to have all of the students follow along in the exercises and to promote physical activity. Additionally, through our continuing education program, students have the ability to sign up for Yoga for Kids and Basketball before the start of the school day. The classes have become so popular that a wait list has started. If a student is unable to pay the fee for participation, the parents may reach out to the program coordinator and be admitted to the program free of charge.
