

Grant Cycle for Energy Projects



The Gardinier Environmental Fund is contributing \$150,000 to support a Sustainable Jersey Grants Program cycle for <u>municipalities</u> and <u>schools</u>. Collaboration on projects between municipalities and schools is encouraged. For this cycle, the Gardinier Environmental Fund will fund energy projects focused on energy conservation, energy efficiency, and renewable energy. The cycle will award **two \$30,000 grants and nine \$10,000 grants**. New Jersey Healthy Communities Registration of Intent to Apply for the 2020-2021 Grants Program

The New Jersey Healthy Communities Network (NJHCN) is seeking Registrations of Intent to Apply for their 2020-2021 Grants Program. NJHCN will grant successful applicants \$10,000 per year for a 2-year grant cycle (2020-2021) for activities that support a change in policies, systems and the built environment to support health through the implementation of evidence-based strategies. Recognizing that the health of disadvantaged communities is impacted by other social determinants of health, NJHCN also supports communities to address these social determinants. This

grant program is not intended to address health education or program strategies. School districts and municipalities are eligible to apply. Review the details of the NJHCN Grants Program <u>here</u>. A Registration of Intent to Apply is required in order for the applicant to be considered for the NJHCN Grants Program. Submit your Registration of Intent to Apply <u>here</u>. It Pay\$ to Plug In: New Jersey's Electric Vehicle Charging Grants Program

It Pay\$ to Plug In provides grants to offset the cost of purchasing and installing electric vehicle charging stations. The program is designed to expand New Jerseys growing network of electric vehicle infrastructure, allowing residents, businesses, and government agencies to purchase and drive electric vehicles. EVs dramatically reduce vehicle emissions and improve air quality for everyone.

It Pay\$ to Plug In has expanded its eligibility criteria to include workplaces, public places, and multi-unit dwellings (apartments, condominiums, and townhouses). The program is open to businesses, governments, non-profit organizations, and educations institutions. Private residential dwellings other than multi-unit dwellings are not eligible for grants.

Upon completion of work in accordance with the eligibility criteria, DEP will reimburse each applicant for a percentage of eligible costs up to a maximum of:

- \$750 per Level 1 charging station
- \$5,000 per single-port Level 2 charging station
- \$6,000 per dual-port Level 2 charging station


