## **April Sustainability Hero**



The April 2020 Sustainability Hero is Michael Winka of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. Serving under ten New Jersey governors, Mike has worked for the state of New Jersey for nearly four decades, first at the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and then for the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJPBU). Read about how Mike drafted and adopted NJDEP's solid waste disposal engineering and environmental impact regulations, including the recycling regulations that helped to establish the first statewide mandatory curbside recycling program nationwide. He was part of an interstate agency team that developed the first statewide Sustainability and Greenhouse Gas Action Plan in the United States and the initial New Jersey team that developed the Regional

Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) CO2 cap and trade program among the ten northeast states. See how Sustainable Lawrence, microgrids, Guttenberg and pork roll fit into the story on the <u>Sustainable</u> <u>Jersey Heroes page</u>.

Before you can move on from your current project and apply for other Sustainable Jersey grant opportunities, the final report for this grant must be completed. Previous grant recipients are ineligible to apply for additional funding until open grants have been closed out. This webinar will walk you through the final report requirements, provide tips on how to write a comprehensive final report (especially in relation to the final report expenditures), and allow ample time for Q&A so that you can submit a complete final report by the deadline.

## FREE Technical Assistance This Summer for Energy Initiatives

Sustainable Jersey is pleased to offer New Jersey municipalities and school districts a unique opportunity to participate in the <u>Environmental Defense Fund's</u> (EDF) <u>Climate Corps program</u>. The program will provide an EDF Climate Corps Fellow, typically a Master's student, (MBA or similar background), with in-depth training in energy project assessment and development, to work with municipalities and school districts during the summer of 2020 for approximately 9-10 weeks. To accommodate COVID-19 restrictions, the Fellows will work remotely. Participating municipalities and schools should be prepared to support collaborative work in an on-line work environment, including providing key information such as utility data.

EDF Fellows provide expertise to help municipalities and school districts take advantage of incentives

for energy efficiency audits and facility and/or equipment upgrades offered by the utility company and <u>New Jersey's Clean Energy Program (NJCEP</u>). The incentives can save significant amounts of energy and money.

EDF Fellows will be made available as follows:

- Thanks to support from <u>New Jersey Natural Gas</u> (NJNG), three Fellows will be available to
  work with Sustainable Jersey municipalities and school districts located within their utility

- EDF and Sustainable Jersey are directly supporting two Fellows to work with distressed municipalities and school districts participating in Sustainable Jersey located throughout New Jersey. ### **ANJEC Scholarship Available for Students**

The Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions (ANJEC) has a scholarship available for \$1,200 through the Hermia Lechner Scholarship Fund. Students would have to fulfill ANJEC criteria, entering either their Junior/Senior year at a New Jersey college in Fall 2020, majoring in an environmental-related field, and should have done work and/or has completed an internship in this field of study.

### **Federal Funding for Transportation Projects**

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) is now accepting applications for the Competitive Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) program. This program seeks to fund transportation projects that will improve air quality and reduce traffic congestion in the New Jersey DVRPC region (Burlington, Camden, Gloucester, and Mercer Counties). School districts are eligible to apply as the designated "Local Public Agency" (LPA), so long as they meet the requirements of the federal CMAQ program. ### NJBPU Announces New Incentives to Expand Local Government Electric Vehicle Fleets

To jump-start the electrification of local government vehicle fleets, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBPU) has created the "Clean Fleet Electric Vehicle Incentive" program, which offers local governments \$4,000 per battery electric vehicle and \$1,500 for one dual-port Level 2 EV charging station. The application window opened on December 1, 2019, and the program will award grants on a rolling basis until April 15, 2020 or until the funding is fully committed. Eligible applicants are local government authorities, which includes school districts, counties, municipalities, and local utility authorities in New Jersey.

To make it easier for local governments to add electric vehicles to their fleets, EVs were recently adding to the State Purchasing Contract. Please review Sustainable Jersey's <u>Alternative Fuel Vehicle</u> <u>Procurement Guide</u> for further details. Sustainable Jersey for Schools points can be earned for the new <u>Sustainable Fleets</u> action in the Green Purchasing category.

### It Pay\$ to Plug In: New Jersey's Electric Vehicle Charging Grants Program

It Pay\$ to Plug In provides grants to offset the cost of purchasing and installing electric vehicle charging stations. The program is designed to expand New Jersey's growing network of electric vehicle infrastructure, allowing residents, businesses, and government agencies to purchase and drive electric vehicles. EVs dramatically reduce vehicle emissions and improve air quality for everyone.

It Pay\$ to Plug In has expanded its eligibility criteria to include workplaces, public places, and multiunit dwellings (apartments, condominiums, and townhouses). The program is open to businesses, governments, non-profit organizations, and educations institutions. Private residential dwellings other than multi-unit dwellings are not eligible for grants.

Upon completion of work in accordance with the eligibility criteria, DEP will reimburse each applicant for a percentage of eligible costs up to a maximum of:

- \$750 per Level 1 charging station
- \$5,000 per single-port Level 2 charging station
- \$6,000 per dual-port Level 2 charging station
