June 29th Deadline Approaching for Student & Staff Wellness Grants

If your district or school is participating in Sustainable Jersey for Schools and serves students in grades 6 and above, there is funding available to help you implement health and wellness actions.

The New Jersey Department of Health (NJ DOH), through its Maternal and Child Health Services Title V Block Grant, is providing \$120,000 for a <u>Sustainable Jersey Small Grants</u> Program cycle. The cycle will fund thirty \$4,000 awards to complete specific Sustainable Jersey for Schools health and wellness actions. Join us for a webinar on May 11th from 3:00-4:00pm to learn more about the programs and activities that could be funded by this grant and the online grant application process. The <u>grant application</u> deadline is **Friday**, **June 29**, **2017**. Notification of grant awards will be made by the end of August, 2017 to implement actions in 2017-2018 school year.

PowerSave Schools

Get free support and resources to educate students about energy efficiency and save money on your school's energy costs.

Sustainable Jersey is partnering with New Jersey Natural Gas (NJNG) and the Alliance Save Energy (ASE) to bring the PowerSave Schools program to 31 schools that are within <u>NJNG's service area</u>. Fifteen schools are returning for a second year in the program and 16 additional schools will be admitted for the 2017-18 school year

16 additional schools will be admitted for the 2017-18 school year.

NJNG will fund all direct program costs for the 31 schools, while the ASE will lead implementation of the PowerSave program in schools, providing the tools and resources to ensure a successful program outcome.

On this 30th anniversary of New Jersey's Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, young writers in grades 4 through 6 are challenged to submit original poems (100 words or less) and high school students in grades 9 through 11 are challenged to submit logo designs and slogans. The poem and logos & slogans should inspire and motivate citizens of all ages to recycle their waste at home, school, work and in the community.

Four winning poems per grade level, and one winning logo design and slogan will be used as part of NJDEP's future statewide recycling outreach efforts, which will include various print and online media.


