91 SCHOOLS ACHIEVE SUSTAINABLE JERSEY FOR SCHOOLS CERTIFICATION IN 2017!

Sustainable Jersey for Schools has announced the 91 schools that achieved the prestigious Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification. The 91 kindergarten through twelfth-grade schools come from 43 different school districts across 18 New Jersey counties. In three years, 194 schools have achieved Sustainable Jersey for Schools certification. A total of 679 schools and 273 school districts are participating in the program overall. New Sustainable Jersey Small Grants Funding Available

The New Jersey Education Association (NJEA), as a Sustainable Jersey for Schools program Underwriter, is contributing \$180,000 to support a <u>Sustainable Jersey for Schools Small Grants Program cycle</u>. With this contribution, NJEA has provided \$750,000 to support a sustainable future for children across the state.

The <u>2017 NJEA Schools Small Grants Program</u> cycle will award:

- Ten (10) \$10,000 project grants to school districts and schools
- Forty (40) \$2,000 grants to schools to support green teams

Applicants must be registered in the Sustainable Jersey for Schools program which is free and voluntary. The funded projects will serve as practical and innovative models for the rest of the State and make measurable contributions toward the long-term goal of a sustainable New Jersey.
