Please answer the following questions in paragraph form.

11. Project Summary (250-word limit) *

Provide a project title and a brief summary of the project. The summary should be concise and focus on the specific action project your team completed. This description may be used in program reports and media communication materials.

12. Science Explanation (250-word limit) *

Describe how the action project is linked to climate change solutions. Include the causes or impacts of climate change the project is addressing and the tangible outcome of the project. Teams are encouraged to do background research to make sure the science is clear and correct for the intended project.

13. Detailed Project Information (500-word limit) *

Describe the project goals; the steps the team took to complete the project; the anticipated positive impact of the project; challenges encountered in completing the project and how they were overcome, or why they persist; and if the team interacted with any community partners in planning or implementing the project.

14. Inspiration (250-word limit) *

Describe what inspired the team to select the project including what or who they were influenced by.

16. How long is your digital story video? *

For example if your video is 3 minutes and 45 seconds enter 3:45. Videos should be no longer than 5 minutes.
