



Certification Actions

Successful completion of actions contributes points towards <u>Bronze or Silver certification</u> and <u>Digital Schools Star</u> recognition. Actions are organized within action categories and some actions have <u>special attributes</u> that are important to be aware of when pursuing certification.





- o Review and revise curriculum
- o Offer professional learning opportunities in authentic learning
- o Implement new activities and strategies in classrooms
- o Assess implementation and make recommendations to continue the cycle of improvement each year

- Implement training for educators on effectively integrating digital citizenship into lessons
- Develop appropriate use policies (AUPs)
- Implement digital citizenship integrated curricula
- Disseminate resources for parents

What to Submit to Earn Points for this Action

- Short narrative of what has been accomplished and the impact it has or will have on the district community
- Digital citizenship plan with vision and goals
- Evidence of professional learning on digital citizenship
- Samples of digital citizenship being integrated into curriculum
- □ Copies of digital citizenship policy documents (ex. AUPs)



- Three examples of how teachers applied their professional learning in digital tools, content and practice




