

- No need to create a new team
- District and/or school level
 - Diverse membership recommended
 - Must have at least two representatives appointed by the union leadership
 - District Green Teams must have school representation

Background

- The NJDOH through its Maternal and Child Health Services Title V Block Grant is contributing \$120,000 for a Sustainable Jersey for Small Grants cycle to fund schools to work on specific Sustainable Jersey for Schools Health & Wellness Actions
- DOH Grantee Agencies can provide technical assistance to assist schools in completing the health and wellness actions.

Types of Technical Support

- Connect schools to state, county or local health resources and/or other schools doing similar work
- Offer youth leadership opportunities with an emphasis on health and wellness
- Hold Parent Engagement Workshops
- Meet in person or participate on conference calls with school health team to offer guidance







Cycle Overview

- Thirty \$4,000 grants to districts and schools
- Online application will open by the end of March and be due Friday, June 10th
- Application Information Package available on Grants & Resources Page or Link from application



Eligibility Requirements

1. New Jersey Public Schools serving grades 6 and above

- School districts with schools serving grades 6 AND above
- High school, middle school, or K-8 school
- 2. Be registered with Sustainable Jersey for Schools **AND** have appointed a **Green Team**.
- 3. Previous Sustainable Jersey for Schools grant recipients
 - \$10,000 Grant Recipients Not Eligible
 - \$4,000 Grant Recipients Eligible if Grant Project Completed by June 10
 - \$2,000 Grant Recipients Eligible
- 4. Grant must be used to implement specific Sustainable Jersey for Schools Health & Wellness action



Eligible Expenses

- Staff salaries and stipends
- Consultant or contractor fees (including training)
- Equipment
- Programmatic or promotional items such as meeting supplies, incentives or awards (limited percent of total budget)
- Educational materials
- Funding can be "flipped" to a non-profit but school district "recipient of record"



I. Eligibility Inquiry

- Sustainable Jersey for Schools Registration
- Green Team
- Previous Grant Recipients
 - \$10,000 or \$30,000 grant recipients must have completed the project and closed out the grant
 - \$4,000 grant recipients must have completed the grant activities and plan to submit a final report by June 17, 2016
 - \$2,000 grant recipients ARE eligible to apply

III. Proposed Project

- Action Selection
- Title and Brief Description
- Action Plan and Timeline
 - Steps you will take to develop and implement the project or program
- Student Engagement
 - How will students be involved

 - How will project advance your health and wellness efforts and who will benefit



III. Proposed Project

- Health & Wellness Team Members (uploaded file)
 - Name, Organization/Department and Role
 - Should include diverse mix of people
- Budget
 - Narrative Description of major components of project expenses and other funds that will be contributed towards the effort
 - Detailed Budget Uploaded as part of Required Attachments, template available <u>HERE</u>
- Evaluation
 - How will you evaluate the success of the effort?



IV. Application Contacts

- Primary Application Contact
 - Person submitting the application
- School District Superintendent
- School Principal (if school is applicant)
- Fiscal Contact
 - Must be a district employee with authorization to handle district funds (most likely Business Administrator)
 - **Cannot** be teacher, club advisor, PTA President
- Media Contact



V. Required Attachments

- Green Team Information (waived for certified schools)
 - Letter/Memo form Superintendent or Principal establishing the Green Team
 - Members Name, Position, Email (must identify designated union representatives)
 - Activity Summary
- Authorization to Submit Grant Application
 - Board Resolution or Letter from and Authorized Party, template available <u>HERE</u>
 - Different from Board Resolution to Participate in Sustainable Jersey for Schools
- Detailed Project Budget
 - <u>Template</u> available but not required



VI. Optional Information

- Letters of Support from Project Partners
 - Parent or Student Organizations
 - Local Union Leadership
 - Municipal Green Team or Municipal Alliance
 - External Organizations (i.e. Rutgers Cooperative Extension)



Tips for Selecting a Project

- Focus on where the needs are relative to student and staff health and wellness
- Make sure the project can be linked to specific outcomes
- Projects are intended to supplement and complement school efforts not support district/school compliance with existing laws and regulations
- Pilot or demonstration projects are welcomed
 - Make sure to include how it will be evaluated and how the results will be shared with the school community



Tips for Preparing a Proposal

- "Sell" the project or program
 - What problem or issue are you trying to address?
 - What is your end goal?
 - How does it leverage existing efforts and/or provide a foundation for future initiatives
 - Where does it fit in the big picture?
- Think through the implementation
- Include representatives from the major stakeholders in the effort
- Be clear and concise quality vs. quantity
- Link to student learning and behavioral change



Tips for Preparing a Budget

- Highlight other funds or in-kind resources that will contribute to the effort
- Demonstrate that you have researched alternatives and have chosen cost effective approaches
- Provide as much detail as possible
- Incentives and awards should be limited to no more than 25% of the total budget



Recipient Requirements

- Online Reporting
 - Interim Report (January 15, 2017)
 - Final Report (June 16, 2017)
- Participation in School Health Summit in May 2017
 - Can include up to \$200 in budget to cover costs of participation (identify as professional development)



Proposal Review Process

- All ELIGIBLE proposals will be reviewed by a "Blue Ribbon Selection Committee" composed of health and wellness experts from the public and private sectors.
- Members of the Selection Committee are not school consultants, staff or Board of Education members.
- Evaluation criteria are listed in Attachment 2 of the Application Information Packet and in the application itself
 - Can use as a checklist in developing your proposal



Grant Awards

- Will be announced by mid-August
- Members of the Selection Committee are not school consultants, staff or Board of Education members.
- Evaluation criteria are listed in Attachment 2 of the Application Information Packet and in the application
 - Can use as a checklist in developing your proposal
- Payment Schedule
 - \$2,500 will be disbursed in early September
 - \$1,500 balance upon completion of the grant funded activities and acceptance of the final report
